

The following Board of Directors positions are up for nomination at this year's conference. If interested, please submit your name to LT Kristina Melendez at anso.sec@gmail.com.

HISTORIAN

The Historian shall compile annually, or cause to be compiled, from the archives of the Association and from other authentic sources, a narrative history of the Association, its activities and accomplishments. Such report should be available for review during the annual conference.

CENTRAL REGIONAL VP

The Regional Vice Presidents shall act as representatives of the President on all matters referred to them by him/her, and at his request shall preside over meetings of the General Convention and the Board of Directors, and shall perform such other duties as are usually incident to the office. In addition, each Regional Vice President shall preside over meetings of their respective region and shall advise the President on matters of policy and procedures concerning the Regional Vice President's respective region. The Regional Vice President of the same region as the President shall assume the duties of the President in the event of his absence, death, inability to serve, or resignation, and in the absence of the *Executive Vice President*. MAA

The Master-at-Arms shall be responsible for keeping peace and good order in all of the meetings of this Association, and in carrying out these responsibilities using tact and good judgment.

SERVICE-WIDE REPS

Each of the Naval Sea Services will elect a representative who would act as service-wide representative to the annual convention and report to the Board of Directors. This elected position would be for two years and be elected through a caucus of each of the sea services.

The Service Wide Representatives are responsible for assuring that the needs and concerns of their respective constituents are presented to the Board of Directors with recommendations for appropriate action. They shall provide liaison, as appropriate, between the President, Board of Directors and their respective constituents; keep the Board updated on programs, which affect the minority officers in the respective service; and assist in the development and implementation of association programs that enhance and assist in the minority officer recruitment, career development and retention programs. There shall be three Service Representatives – one each from the Coast Guard, Marine Corps and Navy – one representative from the officer community and one representative from the enlisted community.

EXECUTIVE VP

The Executive Vice President shall act as the President's representative on all matters referred to him/her. The Executive Vice President, at the request of the President, shall preside over meetings of the General Convention, the Board of Directors, committees, and shall perform such other duties as are incident to the office.

The Executive Vice-President shall advise the president on matters of policy and procedures concerning the association and its chapters. All ANSO chapters are to report to the Executive Vice-President regarding the operation of the chapters.

The Executive Vice-President shall assume the duties of the president in the event of his/her absence, death, inability to serve or resignation.
