Captain Monica Moon was born in Daejeon, South Korea but raised in San Jose, California. She is a graduate of the University of California, Davis with a BA in History. She was contracted in to the United States Marine Corps and attended the Officer Candidate School in the summer of 2003. Captain Moon was then commissioned as a Second Lieutenant into the Marine Corps on 3 September 2004 and graduated The Basic School in June, 2005. Following The Basic School and Adjutant School, Captain Moon reported for duty as Adjutant of Headquarters and Support Battalion, Marine Corps Base Camp Lejeune where she served from 2005 to May, 2008. During this tenure, she obtained the rank of First Lieutenant in September, 2006.

In May, 2008, Captain Moon left active duty, entered the reserves, and moved to San Diego, California. In September, 2008 she obtained the rank of Captain and in October, 2008, she assumed duty as the Administrative Officer for Reserve Support Unit, Marine Corps Installations East.

In addition to her regular duties, Captain Moon is an active member of community related affairs. She currently serves as the Marine Corps Service Representative and Marine Corps Outreach Coordinator for the Association of Naval Services Officers (ANSO)'s National Board of Directors.
