

Commander Adán López, USNR Force Resiliency Officer, CNRFC



Commander Adán López is a native of El Paso, Texas. He enlisted as a Storekeeper (Logistic Specialist) in 1986 under the Sea Air Mariner Program. During his twenty-two years in the enlisted ranks, he served in the following units: Naval Weapons Station Seal Beach Detachment 411, Fleet Industrial Supply Center San Diego, Fleet Industrial Supply Center (FISC) West 211, and FISC Yokosuka.

In 2008, CDR López accepted a commission as a US Navy Human Resources Officer. He served as Training Officer, Executive Officer, and Officer in Charge (OIC) of the Ship Repair Facility (SRF) Yokosuka Navy Operational Support Center (NOSC) El Paso. He also served as OIC of US Navy Pay And Personnel Support Center (NPPSC) Detachment "C" NOSC Phoenix. His next assignment was as OIC of the Operational Support Unit (OSU) NOSC El Paso. From 2018 -

2020, CDR López served as the Executive Officer (XO) for NOSC El Paso. Upon completing his XO tour, he served as the OIC of the Readiness Support Unit (RSU) at NOSC El Paso. Subsequently, he served as OIC of the Defense Information Systems Agency Pacific Command (DISA-PAC). He is on Active Duty orders to Commander Naval Reserve Forces Command (CNRFC) as the Force Resiliency Officer.

CDR López deployed in 2011 to Kandahar, Afghanistan, as an Administrative Officer for the 22nd Naval Construction Regiment out of Gulfport, Mississippi. In 2017, he deployed to Joint Task Force- Guantánamo Bay as an OIC of the J1 Directorate.

CDR López holds a Bachelor's degree in Business Administration, as well as a Master of Education in Administration, from the University of Texas at El Paso. In his civilian employment, he is a middle school principal and has served the El Paso community as an educator for 28 years.

CDR López's awards include the Joint Commendation Medal, the Navy and Marine Corps Commendation Medal, two Navy and Marine Corps Achievement Medals, and the Army Achievement Medal.
