Marina Rabinek is a teal-haired bilingual Super Connector, master networker, and 24-year U.S. Navy veteran. She is currently a graduate student pursuing her Executive Master of Public Service and Administration (EMPSA) degree with a track in nonprofit management at the Bush School of Government and Public Service at Texas A&M University. Marina plans to utilize her EMPSA to assist her in contributing to more policy changes for military women. Her areas of expertise include nonprofit organizations (marketing, outreach, and strategic partnership development), women veterans, and advocacy for the military community.

Marina is the Founder and President of Military Women's Collective, a women-veteran-focused nonprofit that mentors, empowers, and supports military women throughout their careers in the Armed Services.
